

In addition, every Wednesday there is a guest pastor who gives a presentation to the interns sharing their own personal journey about how and why they ended up where they are. Church members are also invited to these very interesting and informative presentations.

Having an exchange of ideas is another benefit of hosting interns. At a recent deacon meeting Avery, Darby, and Eliana shared observations, provided feedback and also shared suggestions on how to improve our services. We need these new ideas. We need to remain open minded to the constantly changing world and the fresh ideas of the younger generation. The older folks

know what has been tried and what worked and what didn't. But the world is constantly evolving and what worked then may not work today and what didn't work then might be appropriate today. Because the world is different now. One of the great advantages of interfacing with the energetic youth of today is that they come unbiased and provide fresh ideas for the current world as it is today.

The opportunity to energize and revitalize Kailua Christian Church is now so I encourage you to jump in the seat of this roller coaster and buckle up if you haven't done so already.
