DEACONS CORNER

For the month of October, the nominating committee will look for members to fill vacant positions.

There is a definite need for more deacons. Originally published in 2006 and revised in 2009 & 2013, the **Board of Deacons Handbook** has provided basic guidelines for doing the job of a deacon. Please read the following sections under **Title of Position: Member of the Board of Deacons: Basic Purpose, Duties and Responsibilities, Organizational Relationship and Position Specifications.**

If you'd like to review the entire 30-page handbook, please ask Kammy Grable for a copy.

BASIC PURPOSE:

Together with the pastor, be responsible for the spiritual welfare of the total Body of Christ.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Attend all Board of Deacons meetings.
- 2. Together with pastor, assist in being responsible for the spiritual health of all members; pray, inspire and provide leadership when needed.
- 3. Assist in the preparation and administration of the sacraments of the church.
- 4. Be a deacon Greeter welcoming visitors/all to Sunday worship.
- 5. Visit the sick, the sorrowing, and the lonely. Inform the pastor of any special need.
- 6. Administer the Deacon's Benevolence Fund.
- 7. Interview all candidates for membership upon recommendation of the pastor to ascertain recommendation to the Church Council.
- 8. Assist in supplying a substitute for the pulpit when necessary. Be host to any special guest speakers.
- 9. The chairperson will submit an annual report. 10. Keep a monthly record of financial transactions for KCC's Deacon's Budget. Provide treasurer
- with list of authorized persons (other than chairman) signing for reimbursement/s requests for checks.
- 11. Coordinate the Sunday fellowship hour and occasional potluck lunches.

ORGANIZATIONAL RELATIONSHIP:

This position is an elected position for a term of two years. There shall be a minimum of eight deacons. The group will elect a chairperson from within their group for a term of one year. Two-thirds (2/3) of the deacons shall constitute a quorum and a majority vote of those present shall be enough to validate an action of the group. They shall meet at least once a month and upon any request by the chairperson or any other two (2) deacons.

The chairperson or a designated deacon becomes a voting member of the Church Council. In the event the moderator is not available for a Council meeting, the deacon chairperson will facilitate the Council meeting.

Aloha e KCC Ohana,

I want to address an important issue that has affected many of you recently: the rise of scam messages and emails that appear to come from me or our church. It's

disheartening to see how prevalent these scams have become, and I want to ensure that we're all informed and protected.

Unfortunately, scams like these often arise from the small traces of personal information that can be found online. From social media platforms like Facebook or the church web-site, our information can inadvertently become accessible. Scammers take advantage of this by cross-referencing names with details like phone numbers and email addresses found in illegal "dark web" databases. Shockingly, many of us have had our information exposed in mass data breaches, making us vulnerable to such fraudulent schemes.

As a church, we face a decision: we can either scrub our website of personalinformation—names, birthdays, and other details commonly shared in our newsletters—or we can leave our information public and accept that occa-sional scam attempts are a reality of the modern world. We can also "password protect" our digital newsletter articles so that you have to register for access through the church to read them.

It's important to understand that scammers cannot access your bank account or steal from you simply by sending these messages. The risk arises only if you respond to their inquiries. I want to assure you that I will never reach out to ask for money or request personal information, such as your birthday or social security number. If you ever receive a suspi-cious message claiming to be from me or the church, please do not hesitate to reach out to the church office directly for verification.

Our priority is to protect you and maintain our community's trust. Together, we can navigate these challenges with vigilance and awareness. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we work to keep our church safe.

TRUSTEES NOTES

Members and Friends of KCC,

Status of KCC Finances as of August 2024:

Income: \$ 76,831.36 Expenses: \$159,026.57

As the financial status shows, Expenses exceed Income by \$82,195.21. To date in 2024, KCC has been operating at an average monthly deficit of \$10,274.40.

Due to our current financial situation, we will defer the Continuous Building Maintenance Fund (CBMF) drive and ask for your help to reduce our deficit by contributing to the general fund. One of the suggestions to increase income was to increase tithes by 10%. We realize that this might be difficult, but if you are able to, we ask for your help by contributing a little more to help reduce the deficit. We always appreciate your generosity.

Also, the Trustees have investigated the following:

- Kama'aina Kids: A walkthrough inspection of the KCC facilities was conducted by Kama'aina Kids representatives in August on the possibility of setting up a preschool. Unfortunately, the available facilities did not meet their requirements.
- Ballet School: A walk-through inspection was conducted by a Ballet Studio in August. Unfortunately, the Ballet Studio decided not to open a ballet school due to the startup cost to renovate the facilities to meet the ballet school requirements.

- Coworking/Shared Office Space: Trustees are continuing to pursue the possibility of leasing space to tenants who are looking for a low cost, coworking/shared office space. On September 17th, we met with Hawaii Technology Development Corporation (an agency of the State of Hawaii) and Hub Coworking Hawaii (Hub),
- which included a tour of the Hub facility, to gather information about Coworking/Shared Office Space. The meeting was very informative. Based on their recommendation regarding Shared Office Space, we will move forward and attempt to lease our two (2) 2nd floor classrooms as Shared Office spaces. So, members and friends of KCC, if you are looking for office space to conduct your business or if you know of someone who is looking for office space in Kailua, please contact Reggie Yamada at email ryamada49@gmail.com. Your support and assistance will be greatly appreciated.
- Student Driver Education: Trustees following up on the possibility of leasing space to private/commercial vendors to conduct driver education at KCC. In efforts to decrease our expenses and in response to the suggestion relating to volunteering, the Trustees plan to eliminate the Janitorial and Yard Services and encourage all members and friends to volunteer your services to help with the janitorial and yard work. Please contact Ms. Susan Morita at email, susanmorita56 @gmail.com, to identify the work that you could do and when the services can be done. Your volunteer support will be greatly appreciated.

If we are unable to reduce our deficit, our assets (e.g., savings, checking) will be depleted soon. We may need to consider reducing other costs, including KCC employees' salaries and benefits. Termination of employment is not under consideration at this time.
