#### **DEACONS CORNER**

John Wesley's 22 Questions



"Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye?" - Luke 6:41

How easy It is to see the flaws of other people, while at the same time be blind to our own faults. A friend of mine recently introduced me to John Wesley's 22 questions as a method of self-reflection. Nearly 300 years ago John Wesley (considered to be the founder of the Methodist movement) and his brother Charles started a small group that met regularly for prayer, bible study, and discipleship. They developed a systemic approach to foster discipleship that had members asking themselves 22 questions daily to examine their own lives. The idea was to help them be spiritually accountable and encourage growth in their commitment to Christ.


After 300 years, these 22 questions are still relevant. Take a look at them and perhaps select a few to focus on that you think would be helpful to strengthen your spiritual condition. Ask yourself those selected questions regularly. How might this kind of honest examination of your spiritual life cause you to reflect on your behavior, attitude, and sincerity of your faith? Sharpen your commitment to Christ? You might be surprised at what you discover about yourself. As you go through these questions just remember that this is a tool not to condemn but for introspection and inspiration.

- 1. Am I consciously or unconsciously creating the impression that I am better than I really am? In other words, am I a hypocrite?
- 2. Am I honest in all my acts and words, or do I exaggerate?
- 3. Do I confidentially pass on to another what was told to me in confidence?
- 4. Can I be trusted?
- 5. Am I a slave to dress, friends, work, or habits?

- 6. Am I self-conscious, self-pitying, or self-justifying?
- 7. Did the Bible live in me today?
- 8. Do I give it time to speak to me every day?
- 9. Am I enjoying prayer?
- 10. When did I last speak to someone else about my faith?
- 11. Do I pray about the money I spend?
- 12. Do I get to be on time and get up on time?
- 13. Do I disobey God in anything?
- 14. Do I insist upon doing something about which my conscience is uneasy?
- 15. Am I defeated in any part of my life?
- 16. Am I jealous, impure, critical, irritable, touchy, or distrustful?
- 17. How do I spend my spare time?
- 18. Am I proud?
- 19. Do I thank God that I am not as other people, especially as the Pharisees who despised the publican?
- 20. Is there anyone whom I fear, dislike, disown, criticize, hold a resentment toward or disregard? If so, what am I doing about it?
- 21. Do I grumble or complain constantly?
- 22. Is Christ real to me?

### **TRUSTEES NOTES**

Members and Friends of KCC,

Status of KCC Finances as of December 2024:

Income: \$273,744.83 (Total Budget Income)
Expenses: \$239,611.21 (Total Operating Expenses)

After a prolonged period of time, Income has finally exceeded Expenses. This \$34,133.62 surplus is attributed to the generous donation that KCC received from the Wendy Tamashiro estate in December. Accordingly, the Total Assets have increased to \$221,438.18. Based on the 2025 "faith-based" budget, there will be an annual deficit of \$52,000. Therefore, if we continue to have an annual deficit of about \$52,000, KCC's resources (assets) will be depleted in approximately four (4) years. However, if the operating expenses increase (e.g., emergency repairs) or income decreases (e.g., drop in tithes and offerings), then this period will be shorted accordingly.

#### **Friendly Reminders:**

Pledge cards for 2025 were mailed to you in November. We ask for your continued support by completing the pledge cards and mailing them back to KCC at your earliest convenience. As you may know, the primary source of income for KCC is from tithes and offerings. Pledge cards allow KCC to develop a "faith-based" budget and plan for upcoming programs and expenses throughout the year. We always appreciate your generosity.





#### MARK YOUR CALENDARS



Lent is a 40-day period of time leading up to Easter that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. This year Lent begins on Wed. March 5th.

The word lent comes from the old English word lencten that means lengthen - referring to the season of spring and longer daytime. The length of Lent represents the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness before beginning his ministry. Lent is a time of spiritual renewal and reflection in preparation of observing Good Friday, the death of Jesus and celebrating Easter, the resurrection of Jesus. Other important dates:

Palm Sunday, April 13: beginning of Holy Week. It's the Holy Day we commenmorate Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem on a donkey and the people celebrated with palm waving and cries of Hosanna.

Maundy Thursday, April 17 when Jesus celebrated his final Passover with his disciples, (the Last Supper) and a new commandment was given for them to love one another as he loved them

Good Fri., April 18, is the day Jesus died and was crucified, before rising again on Easter Sunday.

Easter Sun., April 20th celebrates Jesus's Ressurection from the dead!



#### Stop Worrying and Put Your Trust in God Excerpts shared from Crosswalk article by Cindi McMenamin

God gave us a formula in His Word to help us stop worrying

Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:6-7, NLT).

The very next verse tells us <u>how</u> to stop the worrying, so we can experience that kind of peace that comes through praying about everything:

...Fix your thoughts on what is true, and honorable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable. Think about things that are excellent and worthy of praise (verse 8).

As you focus on God's goodness, God's love, and God's ability to control all that you cannot, there is no room in your mind for fear or worry.

Trust Him. He can control all you think you must and all you are convinced you can't. And He knows exactly what He's doing in your child's life – and yours.
