In the city of New Orleans, the days leading up to Lent (repre-

senting the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert, fasting and resisting temptation from the Devil) are filled with the excitement of Mardi Gras—music, parades, dancing, and a city-wide celebration that seems to have no end. But then, as Ash Wednesday arrives, everything stops. The streets empty. The music fades. The city, once overflowing with life, becomes eerily quiet. 

MODERATOR'S NEWS

It has been my honor and privilege to serve as the Moderator of KCC for the past four-plus years. As of the end of February 2025, I have stepped down from this position.

I was asked in the fall of 2020 to step into this role starting in January of 2021. This was during the middle of the pandemic, and just after the KCC Pastoral Search Committee had finally called Dale Vallejo-Sanderson to be our Settled Pastor. We were full of hope that the pandemic would recede quickly and that we could get back to worshiping and serving and doing ministry together again. That Moderator term was supposed to be for two years.

At that time, we had been without a Settled Pastor for 5 1/2 years and we were still doing church exclusively via Zoom because of our health concerns. I thought that it was remarkable that we were able to call Pastor Dale during a time when all churches were struggling, and some were shuttered, and many people were dying from Covid

Following Dale's departure for personal reasons in 2022, we formed another Pastoral Search Committee and called Pastor Irene Willis Hassan in July of 2023. Under Pastor Irene's leadership we have been able to worship together via Zoom and in person and we are adding a much younger group of people to our congregation. Pastor Irene's example and message and mission emphasis on Jesus calling to us to be transformed by faith into his family and into his image is very hopeful and encouraging.

Before Pastor Irene came, I signed up for another two-year term as moderator from 2023-2024. Last fall I was asked again to serve a third two-year term as Moderator and initially agreed to do so. I have recently decided, however, to step down and out of the leadership of KCC for a while. The primary reason for this is that I am somewhat frustrated with our over emphasis on fund raising and cost savings to protect our assets and the lack of emphasis on missions and ministry. The often-stated assumption that KCC is a "dying church"

does not help. I had not thought that KCC was a "dying church" and don't think that description is accurate or helpful today. KCC has had a lot of setbacks, but we appear to be a faithful church that genuinely loves each other and wants to worship and honor God and serve our community and to spread the good news to others.

During my membership at KCC over the past 39 years we have always been concerned about budgeting too many expenses and not enough income. Up until recently we have done so with what we have called a "faith-based budget" where our anticipated income is significantly less than our anticipated expenses. Over the years we have found that almost no matter what we put into the budget, it almost always balances, and we usually have a surplus. The chart below tracks the gross income and total expenses over the last 15 years which were extracted from our Annual Reports. I believe the figures are accurate. The impression that I get from these figures is that KCC is not a dying church but is and has been consistently quite healthy financially.

The KCC average annual income over the past 15 years has been \$217,080 and the average annual expenses over the same time was \$213,029. This financial picture looks pretty good to me. KCC has become a smaller church recently, but it has a lot

of growth potential.

Whether we have had fulltime settled pastors, or interim pastors, or no pastor, and whether we have had difficulties or good times, KCC has continued to be a faithful community of believers who strive to serve our Lord and each other and minister to our community. As a

former moderator and leader of KCC, I plan to continue to diligently support KCC and this congregation and the current leadership of this loving church.

DEACONS CORNER





TRUSTEES NOTES

Members and Friends of KCC,

Status of KCC Finances as of January 2025:

Income: \$ 12,295.00 (Total Budget Income) Expenses: \$ 13,207.61 (Total Operating Expenses)

As you may have noticed, the income and expenses are low in comparison to the previous monthly financial status. It is because we are starting a new fiscal year. So, we look forward to this year with faith, hope and prayer that we will be able to balance our budget and/or minimize the deficit.

As the financial status shows, Expenses exceed Income by \$912.67. At the start of this fiscal year, KCC has \$221,438.18 in savings and checking accounts (total resources) which include special funds and grants. The available resources (less the special funds and grants) to cover the operating expenses are \$190,354.05.

2025 Budget:

The 2025 Budget was approved by the Congregation at the annual Congregation meeting which was held on December 15, 2024. However, due to comments received, the 2025 Budget was revised and presented to and approved by the Congregation at a special meeting held on February 23, 2025.

Based on this "faith-based" budget, there will be an annual deficit of \$85,354.

Maintenance/Repair Projects:

We are currently working on improvements to the Sanctuary by replacing the lighting system controls, upgrading the audio/sound system and repairing the altar curtain including the removal of the wall-mounted, motorized projector screen.

Pledge Cards and Time and Talent Sheets:

Although the outcome was less than anticipated, we remain grateful to those that submitted pledge cards and time and talent sheets. Your continued support is greatly appreciated.

LENT & EASTER


Lent is a 40-day period of time leading up to Easter that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. This year Lent begins on Wed. March 5th. The word lent comes from the old English word lencten that means lengthen - referring to the season of spring and longer daytime. The length of Lent represents the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness before beginning his ministry. Lent is a time of spiritual renewal and reflection in preparation of observing Good Friday, the death of Jesus and celebrating Easter, the resurrection of Jesus.

Palm Sunday, April 13: beginning of Holy Week. It's the Holy Day we commenmorate Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem on a donkey and the people celebrated with palm waving and cries of Hosanna.

Maundy Thursday, April 17 is when Christians commemorate the supper Jesus shared with his disciples before his crucifixion, when Jesus washed the disciples' feet and instituted the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper, and also a new commandment was given for them to love one another as he loved them.

Good Fri., April 18, is the day Jesus died and was crucified, before rising again on Easter Sunday.

Easter Sun., April 20th celebrates Jesus's Ressurection from the dead! New life in Christ!
